### Agenda

- 1.11 Welcome from Chairman for the last meeting of the year.
- 2.11 Apologies received – reasons heard from Cllr C Daft and Cllr D Marshall; proposal to accept Cllr Wood, seconded Cllr Cawthorn all in favour **RESOLVED**
- 3.11 No declarations of interest at this point.
- 4.11 **Draft notes** previously circulated were proposed as a true and correct record of the meeting held September 2021 by Cllr Cawthorn, seconded by Cllr Jones, all in favour **RESOLVED** Minutes signed and dated by Chairman Cllr Jones.
- 5.11 **Lincolnshire County Councillor Tom Ashton** reported the speed limit reduction on Armtree Rd, Gipsy Drove and Meer Booth Rd had been passed at County Council; the limits will be reduced by 10 miles per hour to 30mph and 40mph for the top of Armtree Rd. This will shortly be out for consultation. Holdingham roundabout works will be completed on time this should improve the movement of traffic at this very busy junction. Funding has been secured to survey the Heckington Junction on the A17 – there is a possibility the road will be returned to dual carriageway. 20 million pounds has been allocated from the levelling up fund for improvements to the A16 all part of the project to improve the access routes in and out of the county.

LCC has purchased two further pumps for use should there be any flooding issues. Red diesel usage has been reviewed and proposals are that it is withdrawn from use for the Drainage Boards and other users however this is being discussed at higher levels and will be revisited; ultimately this if implemented would impact on all rateable properties.

The alliance between South Holland, Boston Borough and East Lindsey is all going well this will save a considerable amount of money by sharing manpower and services.
- 6.11 **Highways** – clerk was asked to contact Viking Link contractors and Highways to re-site the 40mph signs on the B1192 as these are getting blown over by vehicles.
- 7.11 **Finances** – Proposal to pay all invoices as listed Cllr Standage, seconded Cllr Wood all in favour **RESOLVED**; salary plus invoice Oct/Nov £487.92 HMRC £115.80; hall electric £24.56; grass cutting village and hall £75; Antons Gowt Lock hedge £1,844; emergency tree work hall £1,068; donation to St Margaret's Church £200; Poppy appeal £21.

- 8.11 **Speed Indicator** – this was resolved not to use until Spring 2022 hopefully following the reduction in speed as discussed above. Thank you, Cllr Wood, for your work with this initiative.
- 9.11 **Roadside signage** – Clerk had been contacted about signage for properties “beware horses” this was discussed, and the feeling was that it is the owner’s responsibility to make passers by aware of the use of gateways/ accesses with their animals. Signage can be placed within the curtilage of the property.
- 10.11 **Platinum Jubilee 5<sup>th</sup> June 2022** – 1950s style tea party will be held in the hall; clerk will work with the ladies and gentlemen of the villages to promote this and celebrate our Queen’s achievement in style.
- 11.11 **Clerks report** – meeting dates need to be set for the coming year, a list will be provided with the January agenda for approval.
- 12.11 **Budget setting for 2022/23** – Councillors have had the documents showing expenditure and proposals going forward, clerks’ hours/salary to be increased to cover the workload. Proposal to set the Precept at £10,000 Cllr P Cooper seconded Cllr J Wood, no counter proposals heard, vote taken all in favour **RESOLVED**

Clerk was asked to contact East Lindsey about the rules on venting the sheds at the Chicken Farm – also investigate the conditions/guidelines on the planning permission.

Agenda item January – employment of person or persons to carry out various jobs, washing down the marker gates and painting periodically, also white fencing at Church and Antons Gowl, Leagate Road junction, bus shelter cleaning and repair; please send in suggestions for items requiring attention.
