

Minutes of Langriville Parish Council Meeting
Held on April 28th 2026 at 19:30 in Langrick Village Hall

Present:

Pre-Meeting - 10 minute allocation for the Police and Public to speak:

94. Chairmans opening statement - Agenda Item 1 (28/04/2026)

Cllr Ashleigh-Morris welcomed those in attendance and briefly explained recent works to the front of the village hall such as digging out the overgrown front garden. There has been no update from the Diocese yet however, the Pointon's valuation has been sent to them. When it is purchased it will belong to the village but held by the parish council and a point about the village hall will be at every meeting.

Cllr Ashleigh-Morris has had a quote for around £1500 for the ceiling as previously mentioned which would be done after the purchase of the hall. She also suggested that the emersion hot water system be changed as if left on it is very expensive. She has looked in to under sink heaters and would cost around £200 for the system and fitting. The council agreed for this to go ahead.

Cllr Ashleigh-Morris asked if the council agree to Cllr Smith drawing up a new contract for the clerk due to recent minimum wage increases.

95. Apologies for Absence and reasons given - Agenda Item 2 (28/04/2026)

We had apologies from Cllr Matthews and Cllr Perryman.

96. Declarations of Interest - Agenda Item 3 (28/04/2026)

97. Approval of minutes for meeting held March 18th 2026 - Agenda Item 4 (28/04/2026)

The minutes were agreed as a true record and signed.

98. Planning Applications - Agenda Item 5 (28/04/2026)

99. To discuss the Village Hall recent hires - Agenda Item 6 (28/04/2026)

Cllr Ashleigh-Morris shared that we recently have had two troublesome bookings. At one of them a blind was broken and mess was left at another there were a lot of alcohol bottles and containers left on the grounds. Due to this Cllr Ashleigh-Morris asked if the council agreed to ask for a deposit before party hires and to decline any hires that the clerk is suspicious of. The council agreed.

100. Report from Cllr Ashton - Agenda Item 7 (28/04/2026)

Cllr Ashton shared that there is a UK shared prosperity funding that he will share with the clerk, it is a £10k grant for community assets and other things. Once this is received the painting the front, the ceiling and car

park at Antons Gowt can be applied for – agreed by the Council – Clerk will remind Cllr Ashleigh-Morris for quotes.

Lincolnshire 2100 coastal funding communications are going around from the environment agency, Tom briefly explained what these are about. In 2040 the concrete infrastructure is expected to have degraded to a slightly concerning front however, it will be ok for a few more decades to follow. He briefly continued to discuss the East Lindsey housing development plan and how the 2100 program is effecting this.

Cllr Chalmers asked if areas are going to flood, could this be an argument to stop the pylons however, Cllr Ashton responded that if anything it would make the argument for them stronger.

Cllr Ashton is really pleased that the flood and coastal committee has increased their local levy charge by 5%, this is a useful contribution to the work that the environment agency can do.

101. Report from Cllr Jones - Agenda Item 8 (28/04/2026)

Cllr Jones was not in attendance, Cllr Ashton gave Neils apologies.

102. Traffic report - Agenda Item 9 (28/04/2026)

Cllr Perryman was not in attendance.

103. Clerk's Report & GDPR - Agenda Item 10 (28/04/2026)

The clerk informed the council about a optimistic weekly booking for the hall. A craft group would like to hire the hall for three hours every Monday and ask if they can store some craft supplies here, Cllr Ashleigh-Morris has suggested the store cupboard already and a lock to be purchased for it. The council agreed.

The clerk gave the Chairman a sealed list of passwords for all parish council accounts.
