Agenda

1. Welcome from Chairman Cllr Neil Jones.
2. Apologies and reasons heard Cllr P Cooper, RESOLVED to accept, also apologies from County Cllr Tom Ashton.
3. No declarations of interest.
4. Draft notes previously circulated proposal to accept as true and correct record of the meeting Cllr J Wood, seconded Cllr C Daft, RESOLVED all in favour notes signed and dated.
5. No police report.
6. Speed indicator – Cllr J Wood reported that the device seems to make a difference; results are around the same as last month showing a slight increase in speeding vehicles at the Gipsy Drove site, and a remarkable number of vehicles passing the Armtree Road site over a 24 hour period.
7. District Cllr Neil Jones has just had his civic service and is nearing the end of his term as Chairman of East Lindsey.
8. Tree work to the rear of properties on Meer Booth Road, applied for under TPO council support the works but as for copies of the order.
9. Planning – Full permission granted, change of use to rear of properties Armtree Rd to Domestic curtilage. Ebony, Maple Farm, Cedar Lodge & Daybridge.
10. Broad band coverage – no replies from the community help scheme, Steve Brookes at County Council has been contacted and is looking into the issues at Antons Gowt, Chairman is to chase this also with his contacts.
11. Budget – predictions and expenses were presented to councillors for discussion proposal to increase the precept by £300 to £5,300 this will show an increase of less than £2.50 per year for the parish per household. Seconded all voted in favour RESOLVED.

Further items for reporting or discussion – Armtree Road junction with B1192 has seen a spate of accidents with vehicles demolishing the signs and lamp is out of action.

Antons Gowt decorative sign needs a top coat of paint – it has been painted grey, clerk believes this has been done by Mr Hollingsworth and will investigate.
